ask a conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and have appointed Mr. Jones of Arkansas, Mr. Platt, and Mr. Dawes as conferees on their part.

Also, that the Senate have passed with amendments the bill (H. R. 8740) to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to sell to the "Methodist College Association of Southwestern Kansas" certain lands in Kansas; ask a conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and have appointed Mr. Plumb, Mr. Teller, and Mr. Cockrell as conferees on their part.

Also, that the Senate have passed with amendment the bill (H. R. 9268) to punish dealers and pretended dealers in counterfeit money and other fraudulent devices for using the United States mails; ask a conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and have appointed Mr. Mitchell, Mr. Sawyer, and Mr. Reagan as conferees on their part.

Also, that the Senate have passed with amendments the bill (H. R. 9418) to incorporate the Washington and Western Maryland Railroad Company; ask a conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and have appointed Mr. Spooner, Mr. Farwell, and Mr. Faulkner as conferees on their part.

Also, that the Senate have passed with amendments the bill (H. R. 11634) to provide for the allotment of land in severalty to United Peorias and Miamies, in Indian Territory, and for other purposes; ask a conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and have appointed Mr. Dawes, Mr. Morgan, and Mr. Stockbridge as conferees on their part.

Also, that the Senate have passed with amendments the bill (H. R. 5509) to grant to the Gulf and Chicago Air Line Railway Company the right to construct bridges over navigable water courses; ask a conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and have appointed Mr. Vest, Mr. Sawyer, and Mr. Frye as conferees on their part.

Also, that the Senate have passed the bill (H. R. 483) for the relief of Elizabeth Jones, widow of John Jones, deceased, and to place the name of said John Jones on the muster-rolls of Company B, Second Regiment North Carolina Mounted Infantry.

On motion of Mr. Townshend, by unanimous consent, leave was given to withdraw from the files the papers in the cases of W. H. McCabe and W. P. Fowler.

On motion of Mr. Crain, by unanimous consent, leave was granted to withdraw from the files the papers in the case of William M. Douglass.

Mr. Enloe, from the Committee on Enrolled Bills, reported that he did, on yesterday, present to the President of the United States the bills of the House numbered as follows, viz: H. R. 11527, H.
