So, two-thirds voting in favor thereof, the rules were suspended and said joint resolution was passed.

Ordered, That the Clerk request the concurrence of the Senate therein.

Leave of absence was granted to Mr. Morse, for this day.

Mr. Pearson, from the Committee on Enrolled Bills, reported that the committee had examined and found truly enrolled bills and a

joint resolution of the following titles; which were thereupon signed by the Speaker, to wit:

H. R. 5062. An act to grant the Gainesville, McAlester and St. Louis Railway Company the right to build two branch lines and to grant the right of way therefor through the Indian Territory, and for other purposes;

H. R. 5580. An act to protect the insignia and the name of the Red Cross;

H. R. 6078. An act to authorize the Pittsburg and Mansfield Railroad Company to construct and maintain a bridge across the Monongahela River;

H. R. 8698. An act to authorize the Washington and Marlboro Electric Railway Company of Maryland to extend its line of road into and within the District of Columbia;

S. 328. An act granting an increase of pension to Mrs. Martha Curtis Carter, widow of the late Rear-Admiral S. P. Carter;

S. 1535. An act to correct the naval history of John C. Dull;

S. 1539. An act granting a pension to Josephine Foote Fairfax;

S. 2032. An act to grant a pension to Ida C. Martin;

S. 2173. An act to amend an act entitled "An act to establish a United States court in the Indian Territory, and for other purposes," approved March first, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and an act entitled "An act to provide a temporary government for the Territory of Oklahoma, to enlarge the jurisdiction of the United States court in the Indian Territory, and for other purposes," approved May second, eighteen hundred and ninety;

to provide for the re-districting of the Indian Territory for judicial purposes, for an additional judge and more United States commissioners, and to prescribe the jurisdiction, duties, and authority of such judges and commissioners, and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Martin, by unanimous consent, Ordered, That the House take a recess until 7.45 p. m. for the consideration of business pursuant to clause 3 of Rule XXVI, and that said rule be suspended so far as to permit the evening session to commence at 7.45 p. m. and to extend to 11 o'clock p. m.

The Speaker designated Mr. Dockery to preside as Speaker *pro tempore*, at the evening session.

The House then took a recess until 7.45 p. m.

AFTER THE RECESS.
